Launched in October 2013, the Journal of International Mobility is one of the few existing journals dedicated to the question of international learning mobility in Europe and in the world, addressing sector-specific issues, from school education to higher education. Three dimensions rule its development: the scientific approach, the interdisciplinary perspective and the multilingual dimension. Accordingly, diversity is a principle of JIM, whether it is the diversity of the studied areas, the geographical diversity of the researchers involved or the linguistic diversity of submitted articles. These assets allow JIM to establish its specificity firmly in the landscape of scientific journals.

... an acclaimed and rapidly growing area

While international mobility is the subject of ever more research works, demonstrating the richness of this field of study, JIM provides a dedicated space for critical reflection. It offers a genuine broadening of understanding and invaluable keys to a better knowledge of the elements which structure this phenomenon and which often remain unknown to beneficiaries as well as to a number of specialists. In this way, JIM contributes to develop understanding and practices of numerous stakeholders among the communities of teachers, researchers, and specialists of education and training in France and in the world. It also naturally plays its part with public decision-makers in the frame of national and territorial political debates.

An interdisciplinary scientific journal ...

Thanks to contributions from international experts working in the field of social sciences, educational sciences or at the intersection of disciplines, JIM intends to put forward the best possible knowledge of the conditions of development of international mobility, its impacts and related issues at stake linked to international mobility, a phenomenon which is simultaneously sociological, historical, cultural and economic, and which can transform both individuals and businesses. The work of sociologists, economists, geographers, or even semiologists suggests exploring all the dimensions of this field of study, which transcends the traditional fields of the educational sciences.. The Selection Panel pays particular attention to the scientific value of articles proposed. These must be based on field studies as well as a proven methodology.

...multilingual

The pool of contributors now goes beyond the European context and is becoming increasingly international, in a trend which will intensify over the coming years. The Selection Panel consists of academics and European researchers. With the same desire to promote opening up to the world and linguistic diversity, Erasmus+ France / Education and Training proposes to publish original articles in French, English, German or even Spanish.
